Bruce Carter, North Street – Stated he has lived in Union City since 1970. Where there are no fences people put plants, clotheslines, etc. over the lines. He believes that if the fences are 2' off the property line the other property owner will think he owns the property to the fence.

Mike Farrell, West High Street – Stated he disagrees. They should use the survey markers.

Solicitor Wachter – To be in compliance with the ordinance you would need to have a survey completed. The proposed amendment would only effect new fences.

Glenn Himrod, Hemlock Street – Asked if the fence is on the line could the neighbor deny you access to his side of the fence when you need to maintain it? Solicitor Wachter stated that they could. Glenn feels 2' is excessive.
