

**UNION CITY BOROUGH
ERIE COUNTY PENNSYLVANIA
ORDINANCE NO. 1164**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF UNION CITY, COUNTY OF ERIE, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA, AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1111, AS AMENDED, KNOWN AS THE BOROUGH OF UNION CITY QUALITY OF LIFE TICKETING ORDINANCE, AS AMENDED, BY AMENDING SECTION 7 PERTAINING TO FINES AND PENALTIES, TO PROVIDE FOR A PENALTY UPON CONVICTION OF A VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE; AND PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER, SEVERABILITY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on or about August 22, 2017, the Borough Council of the Union City Borough (the "Borough Council"), adopted Ordinance No. 1111, colloquially known as the Borough of Union City Quality of Life Ticketing Ordinance, as has been amended, (the "Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council has determined that a provision should be included in the Ordinance to add a penalty which can be enforced upon conviction of any person, firm or corporation for violations of the Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council finds that such an amendment is in the best interest of the citizens and residents of the Borough.

NOW THEREFORE, this 2nd day of October 2023, **BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED** by the Borough Council, Union City Borough, Erie County, Pennsylvania, the following:

Section 1. Recitals. That the above recitals are incorporated as if more fully set forth herein.

Section 2. Amendment of Section 7 of the Ordinance. That Section 7 of the Ordinance, as amended, entitled Fines and Penalties, be amended in applicable part, through the inclusion of the underlined terms and deletion of the terms struck out as follows:

Section 7. Fines and Penalties

...

F. Any person, firm, or corporation who or which shall violate any provisions of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of no more than \$1,000, plus costs, and in default of payment of said fine and costs, to imprisonment for a term not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation continues after due notice has been served, in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Ordinance, shall be deemed a separate offense.

Section 3. Severability.

If any section, subsection, paragraph, provision, regulation, limitation, restriction, sentence, clause, phrase or word in this Ordinance is declared for any reason to be illegal, unconstitutional or invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction or other tribunal, such decision shall not affect or impair the validity of this Ordinance as a whole, or any other section, subsection, paragraph, provision, regulation, limitation, restriction, sentence, clause, phrase, word or remaining portion and each section, subsection, paragraph, provision, regulation, limitation, restriction, sentence, clause, phrase, or word hereof irrespective of the fact that any one or more of the sections, subsections, paragraphs, provisions, regulations, limitations, restrictions, sentences, clauses, phrases or words may be declared illegal, unconstitutional or invalid.

Section 12. Repealer.

All ordinances, rules or resolutions or parts of ordinances, rules or resolutions inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby expressly repealed.


Section 13. Effective Date.

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately after enactment as provided by law.




